

























### **Charles B. Howdill**

1863 Born in Leeds

**1879** Articled to his father Thomas Howdill's architecture practice

**1880s** Studied at Leeds College of Art, assistant to his father

1888 National Gold Medal for post office design

1894 Marries Laura Garth: they later have seven children, six of whom reach adulthood

1897 First trip abroad, to Holland; experiments with colour photography

1901 First exhibited at Royal Photographic Society: later took part in five other shows

1902 President of Leeds Camera Club

1905 Travels to Austrian Alps; 1906 visits Corsica; 1907 visits Serbia; 1911 visits Jutland

**1912–13** Blazing Balkans lecture tour

1913–28 Teaches at Huddersfield Building College and other local institutions

1941 Dies in Leeds
